




### J. ARTHUR MIDDLETON Producer




#### RON TEMPLER Director





#### ANNIE - The Synopsis

It is December of 1933 and America is in the midst of the Great Depression. On the Lower East Side of New York, the Municipal Orphanage, Girl's Annex, has been the drab home of eleven-year-old Annie for all but the first two months of her life, when she was left on the front steps of the Orphanage with an unsigned note and half a locket.

Annie seizes the opportunity to escape the Orphanage and Miss Hannigan, the mean-tempered spinster who is in charge of the Orphange, by hiding in a laundry bag. In New York's St. Mark's Place she adopts "Sandy" a stray dog that had escaped from the Dog Catchers. In search of her parents, she meets the Hooverites, an assortment of unemployed New Yorkers who live in shanties below the 59th Street Bridge. Annie is arrested during a raid on Hooverville and returned to the Orphange.

Annie's adventures continue as she is invited to spend the Christmas holidays with Mr. Oliver Warbucks, the billionaire. As his love for Annie grows, he decides to initiate a search for Annie's parents and on a radio program offers a certified cheque for \$50,000 to anyone who can prove that they are Annie's parents. Many couples claimed to be her parents but all turned out to be fakes. Meanwhile, back at the orphanage, Miss Hannigan, her con-artist brother Rooster, and his floozy girlfriend Lily, make plans to get that money. Rooster and Lily disguise themselves as Ralph and Shirley Mudge and Hannigan supplies them with the information regarding the locket.

Sensing that something is phony about the Mudge's, Warbucks and Grace turn to Roosevelt for help from the F.B.I. They work through the night and find unhappy news for Annie - her mother and father died years ago. But then who are Ralph and Shirley Mudge? Who knew about the locket? Miss Hannigan.

As everyone arrives at Warbucks' mansion Christmas morning, the Secret Service arrests Rooster, Lily and Miss Hannigan. Sandy who has been found for Warbucks by the police is returned. Happy ending as Annie, Warbucks, Grace and all agree that this Christmas is the beginning of a wonderful new life.


