Northumberland Players provides opportunities in all aspects of quality theatre — over 300 enthusiastic, *un-paid volunteers* who work as actors, directors, producers, set builders, costume makers, etc., are proof there is passion for live theatre in Northumberland County. When you attend a not-for-profit theatre company, your entertainment dollars stay in the community, the cultural and economic benefits rippling throughout Northumberland County

We also welcome members and volunteers to join us in producing quality theatre.



#### Jamie Spereman (Kris Kringle)




