On August 5, 1914, a contingent of Cobourg men marched off to war. Over the next four years the Town of Cobourg gave unflagging support to the soldiers caught up in a conflict that would forever change Canada – and Cobourg.

ARMISTICE 18 - THE HISTORY

Ten years after the end of WWI, Cobourg's Old Bailey Court Room was the scene of a sensational trial that has been called "the last battle of the Great War." The case was a libel suit brought by Sir Arthur Currie, the general who had led the Canadian Corps to victory in 1918. The cause of his grievance was a front-page article in a Port Hope newspaper which claimed that Currie had needlessly wasted Canadian lives in the capture of Mons on the last day of the war. The trial placed Canada's entire role in the Great War under a spotlight and kept the country riveted for weeks. A new play about this epic trial is the centerpiece of Armistice 18, a seven-week arts festival commemorating this pivotal era in our history.



THE POPPY TRAIL COME WALK OUR HISTORY



Acclaimed as one of Ontario's most beautiful towns, Cobourg also has a fascinating past. When war was declared on August 4, 1914, Cobourg's harbour was dotted with yachts, its many hotels were filled with visitors, and wealthy Americans were hosting garden parties at their large summer homes by the lake. Yet the very next day, the men of the Cobourg Heavy Battery marched off to war and for the next four years, Cobourg would do its all for King and Empire.

This fall visitors will be able to experience Cobourg's Great War history in a unique way. Over 20 sites with World War I significance will be highlighted with signs and historic photographs. A free printed guide will provide an informative self-guided walking tour of the Poppy Trail. And on the weekends (Oct.14 - Nov.4) knowledgeable

guides will provide walking tours of the Poppy Trail in the town's historic downtown.


