












Director's Notes

Though I read *The Glass Menagerie* in high school, my first moment of clarity with the play was when I saw it performed in Toronto with Shirley Douglas as Amanda and Kiefer Sutherland as Tom. This was in 1997 and I've never forgotten the impact it had on me. Not only were the performances wonderful, but the director's (Neil Munro) vision came across clearly.

When the Players offered me *The Glass Menagerie* to direct I jumped at it. Still remembering the wonderful performance so many years ago, I was excited to bring a play that I have a previous 'relationship' with to life. *The Glass Menagerie*, in my opinion every bit as important and integral to modern theatre as *A Streetcar Named Desire*, was the work that cast a young Tennessee Williams from obscurity to fame. The play is about a family of three, Amanda the mother, Tom the son, and Laura the daughter, the fourth member of the family, the father, having left them all for parts unknown years before. The final character, the gentleman caller, is the fulfillment of the wish we all have for the family.

I could go on and on about the characters and the vision I had while directing this show. The extremely talented cast makes it unnecessary; they have taken the emotions and commentary on family that I wanted to show and brought them to life. I would like to point out that one of the reasons the cast has had the ability to bring this show to a very realistic place is the beauty and authenticity of our set. I would love to be able to take full responsibility of this set, however it would be a lie. Will Ryan, first time set designer for the Northumberland Players, has set a new standard for sets in small spaces. If there's anything I can claim responsibility for it's for not getting in his way (too much).

The Glass Menagerie has been an experience of a lifetime for me. This is the first show I've directed in 20 years (since university) and, I must admit, I didn't know if I was up for it. The Northumberland Players has always been good to me and incredibly supportive when I've acted in shows and they kept that tradition going with me moving to directing. All names listed in this program have earned a significant 'thank you' from me. Without the creative, dedicated, and hard work from everyone associated with this show I would have been left spinning. If you love the show as much as I do, then it's them you need to thank. If you don't, blame me.


We also welcome members and volunteers to join us in producing quality theatre.


